

Some of his Outstanding Business Accomplishments, just to name a few, are the construction of two ferries for the Mexican Government, a passenger ferry that works at the foot of Canal St. in New Orleans for the Mississippi River Bridge Authority, a 600-ft mooring barge for the Louisiana Army Corps of Engineers, a national park service boat that works on the Great Lakes, and a dredge barge for Great Lakes Dredge and Dock and the very first tug named "Shirley P. Settoon" was sold to the Government of Peru. # Settoon Towing Policies

## **3.13 Safety**

Settoon Towing, LLC employees are the Company's most valuable resource and its principal importance that Settoon Towing, LLC employees return safely to their families after each and every hitch.

Settoon Towing, LLC is committed to the safety and health of all employees and recognizes the need to comply with regulations governing injury and accident prevention and employee safety. Maintaining a safe work environment, however, requires the continuous cooperation of all employees.

Any employee who is ever in doubt about how to safely perform a job should ask his or her supervisor for assistance. Any suspected unsafe conditions and all injuries that occur on the job must be reported immediately in accordance with Settoon Towing, LLC protocol. Compliance with these safety rules is considered a condition of employment. Therefore, it is a requirement that each supervisor make the safety of employees an integral part of his/her regular management functions. It is the responsibility of each employee to accept and follow established safety regulations and procedures.

Employees who have a concern or wish to report a violation of the Settoon Towing, LLC guidelines should notify their supervisor. If an employee does not wish to report the concern or violation to his supervisor for any reason, he may report directly to Human Resources. Employees who violate Settoon Towing's safety policies will be subject to disciplinary action, which may include termination of employment with Settoon Towing, LLC.

Each employee is expected to obey safety rules and exercise caution and common sense in all work activities.

## **4.9 Use of Computer, Phone, and Mail**

Settoon Towing LLC property, including computers, phones, electronic mail, and voice mail, should be used only for conducting company business. Incidental and occasional personal use of company computers, phones, or electronic mail and voice mail systems is permitted, but information and messages stored in these systems will be treated no differently from other business-related information and messages.

Settoon will, from time to time, intercept, record, copy, erase and listen to communications transmitted over all such electronic communication devices provided or paid for by Settoon. By accepting and continuing employment with Settoon, employees waive any right to privacy that they may have otherwise had in such communications and expressly authorized Settoon personnel to intercept, record, copy, erase and listen to any such communications. If employees want to have a confidential communication, they may do so while on break using their own cell phones.

## **4.10 Social Media**

The main thing employees need to remember about utilizing social media sites is that the same basic policies apply in these spaces as in other areas of their lives. The purpose of these guidelines is to help employees understand how Settoon Towing policies apply to these newer technologies for communication, so you can participate with confidence.

Follow all applicable policies. For example, you must not share confidential or proprietary information about Settoon and you must maintain customer and co-worker privacy. Remember, you may not do or say anything online or through social media that you would not be able to do or say on Settoon's premises. This includes using language or symbols that are considered to be harassing, discriminatory or threatening.

Write in the first person. Where your connection to Settoon is apparent, make it clear that you are speaking for yourself and not on behalf of Settoon. In those circumstances, you may want to include this disclaimer: "The views expressed on this [blog; website] are my own and do not reflect the views of my employer."

If you communicate in the public "internet" about Settoon Towing or Settoon Towing related matters, disclose your connection with Settoon Towing and your role at the Company. It is a violation of federal law for you to endorse Settoon or its services without disclosing your relationship as an employee of Settoon. While we are proud of the job that we do, we do not ask our employees to endorse Settoon on social media sites. Use good judgment and strive for accuracy in your communications; errors and omissions reflect poorly on Settoon, and may result in liability for you or the Company.

Use a personal email address (not Settoon's address) as your primary means of identification. Just as you would not use Settoon's stationery for a letter to the editor with your personal views, do not use your work e-mail address for personal views.

Do this on your own. Settoon Towing does not ask that any of its employees engage in online or social media postings regarding the Company. In fact, we would rather that you do not mention Settoon Towing at all. However, to the extent that you do engage in such activities, you must do so on your own time.

## TOBACCO USE AND ORAL HEALTH

### How the dental profession may help people to stop smoking

Of the 46 million U.S. adult smokers, 50 percent see a dentist each year. Even if only a small percentage of them were influenced to quit through dentist counseling, the positive effects would be enormous.

To that end, a study will examine how dentists can utilize tobacco-use intervention techniques to educate dental patients in overcoming their tobacco addiction. Delta Dental is assisting in the five-year study. The project, a collaboration between Delta Dental and the University of California, San Francisco School of Dentistry, involves recruited dentists in California, Pennsylvania and West Virginia who received different levels of training in tobacco cessation counseling. In 2006, these dentists' patients are being surveyed to identify the benefits of the training and to compare the results with those of patients who visited dentists who received either less intensive training or no training at all.

### How does tobacco use affect your oral health?

While most people are aware of the impact tobacco use has on their overall health, some might not consider its effects on oral health, including:

- 50 percent of smoking adults have gum (periodontal) disease. Smokers are about twice as likely to lose their teeth as non-smokers.
- Cigarette smokers are twice as likely to need root canal treatment.
- Smoking leads to reduced effectiveness of treatment for gum disease.
- Smoking increases risk of mouth pain, cavities and gum recession (which can lead to tooth loss).
- Tobacco reduces the body's ability to fight

infection, including in the mouth and gums.

- Smoking also limits the growth of blood vessels, slowing the healing of gum tissue after oral surgery or from injury.

- Smokeless tobacco (snuff or chewing tobacco) is associated with cancers of the cheek, gums and lining of the lips. Users of smokeless tobacco are 50 times more likely to develop these cancers than non users.

- Cigars, chewing tobacco, snuff and unprocessed tobacco leaves (used as cigar wrappers) contain tiny particles that are abrasive to teeth. When mixed with saliva and chewed, an abrasive paste is created that wears down teeth over time.

### Tobacco use and children

All parents, even those who do not use tobacco, should educate themselves and their children about the dangers of smoking:

- 3,000 children and teens become regular users each day (including chewing tobacco).

- Nearly one-quarter of all high school students smoke.

- Some tobacco companies target children with cherry-flavored chewing tobacco sold in colorful containers and sweet-smelling candy-flavored cigarettes packaged in shiny tins.

- Children exposed to tobacco smoke may have delays in the formation of their permanent teeth.

- Women who smoke may be more likely to have children born with an oral cleft (cleft lip or cleft palate).®

### What you can do

If you are a smoker or a parent with a child or teen who you suspect may be using tobacco, you can start by understanding that tobacco dependence is a nicotine addiction disorder.

There are four aspects to nicotine addiction: physical, sensory, psychological and behavioral. All aspects of nicotine addiction need to be addressed in order to break the habit. This difficulty can mean that tobacco users may need to try several times before they are able to successfully kick the habit.

# Safety Corner

## Stairway Safety

Stairways are a major source of injuries in the marine industry. Many injuries occur due to employees being careless, as well as not using stairways properly. It is important to always use handrails when ascending and descending stairways. These handrails are there for your safety and can be used to prevent accidents from occurring. Always maintain three points of contact, keeping one hand free to hold onto the railing. On your vessels, the stairs should be treated as a ladder and descended backwards because of the angle they are installed. At all times, the stairways on your vessel should be free of tripping hazards. Slippery conditions on stairways should be eliminated before the stairways are used to reach other levels. Inspection of your stairways should be conducted periodically. These inspections can prevent a future incident from occurring. While inspecting your stairways, pay particular attention to the non-skid surfaces. These surfaces should still be intact, if they are not, please contact the safety department. We encourage you to contact the safety department for any unsafe conditions on your vessel. Remember, safety starts with you.
